Parkway Turf Renovations, Phase II

Our parkway turf has become overrun with broadleaf weeds, in part due to the mandated water restrictions. We are using the cooler Fall weather, relief from water cutbacks and a very strong weed abatement program. Since early September we are using pet and people safe products to eliminate the weeds and bring the turf back to a nice, thick, healthy tall fescue lawn. There will be some ugly whitening as the weeds can no longer produce chlorophyll and they begin to die off. We will also be adding soil conditioners to help the shallow soil hold onto the irrigation water we apply.



Reverse 911

We have had a number of questions and phone calls about how to register your phone for reverse 911 phone calls. You can register your phone, including your cell phone, at this address

http://www.readysandiego.org/alertsandiego/

ReadySanDiego or Alert San Diego is a countywide database that is accessible to emergency services for community alerts.

It contains contact information for the whole county and does not stop at a city border.

When we create a reverse 911 alert, we draw an area on a map where we need the community alerted. This area can include contact information for a bordering city and the alert will be sent to all the houses with registered contact information within the selected map area.

What can you do?

Make sure you have registered all your phones at #AlertSanDeigo

Follow the instruction given in the alert when the alert is received

Contact your neighbors or any older residents that might not be registered for the alerts and share the information.

Recently, a mountain lion has been seen in the Rancho La Costa Preserve! This natural area borders our homes.

Remember, to keep your eyes open! It's the time of year for rattlesnakes, coyotes, mountain lions and wildfires. As the weather heats up, so do the risks. Take proactive steps to avoid dangerous encounters when you are out and about.



- Be aware of your surroundings at all times.
- Keep Pets on a short leash.
- Keep children close at hand.
- Be especially careful near dusk and dawn.
- Consider carrying a noisemaker, bells or whistle. We've seen hikers carry a tall walking stick or golf club as well.
- Never turn your back on an animal you encounter. Keep Calm! Keep facing the animal as you back away from it.
